



TAP's story started in 2003 when a small group of people gathered in a living room to discuss how to address the long term needs of individuals with aphasia. Individuals with this devastating communication disorder were experiencing social isolation, being unable to return to vocational, recreational and even family roles. The Triangle Aphasia Project was born.



At the age of ten, we have seen tremendous growth and progress in our mission. We now serve over 200 individuals with aphasia, their families and the community. We have secured a home base in Cary, but our services span throughout the region. We currently have eleven therapy groups across the Triangle. We continue to provide "Learning to Speak Aphasia" training for family, friends, healthcare professionals and community members. We have expanded to include child-specific services and music therapy. We are proud to collaborate with all local medical centers and universities to provide individuals with seamless transitions to the community and reduce social isolation. We are also happy to work with several non-profit organizations in the area to engage individuals fully in their

communities. With decreasing access to traditional therapy due to insurance reductions, the services that TAP provides are more important than ever.

We are thrilled to celebrate the past 10 years. We intend to *Continue the Conversation* through life-changing programs for clients and their families, facilitating HOPE, DETERMINATION, PURPOSE and ENGAGEMENT!
